PTA



Homework

Homework will continue to be set on line. If your child has changed class you will need to accept the notification to join their class page. Any problems please contact your child's class teacher or contact the school office admin@kp.starmat.uk.

PE Kit

All children need to have their PE kit in school everyday. We are happy for them to bring it in on a Monday and take it home for washing on a Friday. We will be doing indoor and outdoor PE this term and all children will be completing the golden kilometre during the week. If children do not have their PE kit unfortunately, they can not do PE. Please can I remind you that all children need to remove earrings for PE, not have them taped, and therefore if your child can not remove them, please can you remove them on PE days.



Uniform

Please can I also remind everyone that the only pieces of jewelry children should be wearing are a watch if they so wish and small plain studs as earrings. No 'dangly' earrings please or hoops. Could nail varnish also please be removed for school.

Water bottles

We encourage all children to bring a named water bottle containing **only water** to have access to throughout the day. If they wish, they may bring a bottle or carton of juice or squash to have with their lunch but not throughout the day.



Unfortunately we still have children bringing juice to drink throughout the day. Please can children only have plain water in their bottle during the day unless this is an exceptional circumstance that has been discussed with school staff.

Thank you for your help and cooperation with this.

Drop off and pick up

Thank you to everyone for continuing to use our one way system when on the school premises.. It really does help easy congestion at the main entrance and for people leaving after delivering or collecting children from Daffodils.

Please can we ask, with restrictions now lifted, that parents wait for their child on the playground whenever possible, rather than congregating outside the school gate. It does become very congested on the pavement and it is difficult for people with pushchairs to get past or for the children returning from swimming.

Please do remember that the only cars that should park in the layby are parents with a 'blue badge', the school bus, and any other school transport (e.g. coach on a Wednesday) also need access to the layby to safely deliver or collect children from school. Please therefore can no other parents use the layby for parking when dropping off or collecting their children from school.

Many thanks for your cooperation with the above.

School meals

Thank you to everyone who is pre ordering your child's meals. This is a real help as we then know what you have chosen is something they like and we can, if needed, encourage them to eat. .

If your child does not normally have a school meal, please do take a look at the menu, as our school dinners are truly scrumptious and your child might fancy trying one of them. Pizza day is always a favourite and our Chair of Governors, who had dinner with the children yesterday, can definitely youch for that.

We have signed up to this scheme and therefore if you shop at Morrison's we would value your support. We will be sharing with you more details on how you can help, without really doing anything other than your normal shop. As we have such an amazing outside space here at Kellington we are really keen to ensure we utilise it to enhance the children's learning experience.

Attendance

Please continue to ensure that your child comes to school everyday that they possibly can.

We are working extremely hard to enable all the children to not be disadvantaged by their lost learning due to the issues over the last 18 months and therefore they need to be here, in school, for us to be able to support them to be the best they can be.

Any holidays taken in term time, unless there are extenuating circumstances, is recorded as unauthorised absence and you could be fined. If you do take your child out of school, please be honest with us about the reason. If it is for a holiday you do need to complete a specific form and potentially speak to Mrs Humphrys.

Please can I remind everyone to inform us promptly if your child is absent from school, we do need a message via telephone or email as early as possible, by 9.30 am at the latest, however sooner is preferable. If we do not hear from you we have a duty of care to make contact to establish where your child is. We will keep ringing you until we get a reply. If we don't get a reply we could have to report your child as a missing child.

We know this is sometimes difficult but whenever possible please try and make any appointments outside of school hours, or at the beginning or end of the school day.

Being late does also have an impact on your child's learning, as this starts the minute they walk through the door and if your child is late (5 minutes after the start time) they will miss vital teacher input and new learning for that day. We also have interventions, which support gaps in your child's learning, starting as soon as they arrive, so again if they are late they are not able to access these effectively.

Keeping children safe: Covid 19-

Please can I remind you that if your child or anyone in the family shows any of the following symptoms you should seek a PCR covid test ASAP

A new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell.

Please then follow the guidance in relation to isolating given by Track and Trace. Do inform school if your child tests positive or if they are advised to isolate.

Please can all forms that have been sent home in relation to personal details be returned to school even if there are no changes. If you have received a 'Remote learning User Agreements'

to be completed please return this to school ASAP as it is important we have these in place should remote learning become necessary for your child for any reason. Many thanks

Free School Meals

If you think you may be entitled to Free School Meals please do contact the school for further information on how to check your eligibility and apply. Even if your child is in KS1 and is currently receiving a universal free school meal, if you are eligible for FSM it is really important that you apply, as there are still additional benefits for your child.
