Uniform

Please can we ask that you put your child's name in their uniform. We are still finding jumpers, shorts, shoes etc around school without names and often there doesn't appear to be anyone missing them. Also having your child's uniform named helps prevent the wrong person going home in it!

PE Kit

We do still have too many children who do not have their PE kit in school on PE days **All children need to have their PE kit in school everyday.** We are happy for them to bring it in on a Monday and take it home for washing on a Friday. We will be doing indoor and outdoor PE this term and all children will be completing the golden kilometre during the week. If children do not have their PE kit unfortunately, they can not do PE and they will complete activities linked to the PE lesson. Please can I remind you that all children need to remove earrings for PE, not have them taped, and therefore if your child can not remove them, please can you remove them on PE days.



Water bottles

We encourage all children to bring a named water bottle containing **only water** to have access to throughout the day. If they wish, they may bring a bottle or carton of juice or squash to have with their lunch but not throughout the day.

Please can we also ask that water bottles are clearly labeled as many children have the same or very similar water bottle. Thank you for your help and cooperation with this.



Drop off and pick up

Please can I remind everyone that dogs should not be brought onto the school grounds at all. We do encourage children to bike or scooter to school, however please can children dismount at the school gates.

Please do remember that the only cars that should park in the bus layby other than the school bus and coaches are parents with a 'blue badge' or a school transport taxi. Please can no other parents use the layby for parking when dropping off or collecting their children from school. Unfortunately we have had an instance when a parent, who was legitimately trying to use the layby, asked another adult who had parked in the layby, without a blue badge, to please move; they were verbally abused. It saddens me that members of our school community can treat each other this way and I ask once again for understanding, tolerance and compliance with this matter and there not to be a repeat of this situation.

Attendance had been slightly better this week as fortunately we haven't had as many children poorly with the various illnesses that are going around.


Keeping children safe: Covid 19-

Please can I remind you that if your child or anyone in the family shows any of the following symptoms you should seek a PCR covid test ASAP

A new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell. Please then follow the guidance in relation to isolating given by Track and Trace. Do inform school if your child tests positive or if they are advised to isolate.
