An opportunity to chat informally about how your child has settled in and to ask questions and learn a little more about our school routines in both nursery and reception, school meals, and the PTA. Please come and join us in the hall once you have dropped off your child in their classroom.

Please come to your child's classroom door at 2.45pm Parents of children in Sunflowers please feel free to bring your child back to their classroom at 2.45pm for you to enjoy some time with them in their classroom environment.

During your visit to the classroom please feel free to ask any questions and enjoy joining in an activity with your child. Each class has something planned for you to undertake with your child and it is an opportunity to see where they learn. If you have a child in another class, please feel free to split your time between the two classrooms. Unfortunately we do only have capacity for a **maximum of two adults per child** in the classroom.

At approx 3.10pm we will ask all parents to leave the classrooms so we can allow the children to collect all their belongings together and to be dismissed from their classrooms as normal, at the end of the school day.

3.30pm 'Late Summer Festival'

Children from all classes will be performing a short event for you on the stage. **We will start the entertainment at 3.45 pm** with Sunflowers performing first, followed by Daffodils, then Roses, then Tulips, then Lilies. Each class will perform in turn on the stage in the hall. We do hope you will be able to join us and watch your child's short performance.

Outside there will be refreshments on sale: hotdogs, cakes, tea, coffee and juice and there will be a tombola, a raffle, a pre-loved uniform stall and maybe a couple of other stalls for you to enjoy.

After many months of not being able to hold whole school events we hope you will enjoy this opportunity to socialise and to provide a live audience for the children's performances.

The PTA holds some items of 'pre-loved uniform'. If you wish to purchase any item please do not hesitate to contact one of the PTA committee. Should you wish to donate any items of good quality uniform that you no longer need, the blue bin is the PTA's uniform collection bin and will be outside school from next week. There will be an opportunity to buy pre-loved uniform at the event on the 1st October.

On Monday 1st November the PTA will be running the Halloween disco. There will be a session for children in nursery, reception Year 1 and Year 2 from 3.30-4.15pm and then a second session for children in Years 3-6 from 4.30-5.15pm. More details to follow soon.

Junior Leadership Team

Homework

Homework will continue to be set on line. If you are having issues accessing the homework, you need to log on to Google using your child's log in, go to Google Classroom and accept the Invitation to join the class. Communication

Parents of children in Sunflowers and the Reception children in Daffodils, can see what their children have been up to by accessing their child's Tapestry account. After half term we are potentially looking to launch a new parent communication system called Marvellous Me.

Uniform

Please can we ask that you put your child's name in their uniform. On a warm day, jumpers and cardigans are taken off and it makes it very difficult to find their rightful owner. For our younger children it is important that you name everything. It is not unheard of for children to go home in someone else's shoes after changing for P.E. as many children have the same or very similar styles. Unfortunately they don't appear to notice if they are two sizes too big or too small!

PE Kit

All children need to have their PE kit in school everyday. We are happy for them to bring it in on a Monday and take it home for washing on a Friday. We will be doing indoor and outdoor PE this term and all children will be completing the golden kilometre during the week. If children do not have their PE kit unfortunately, they can not do PE and they will complete activities linked to the PE lesson. Please can I remind you that all children need to remove earrings for PE, not have them taped, and therefore if your child can not remove them, please can you remove them on PE days.



Water bottles

We encourage all children to bring a named water bottle containing **only water** to have access to throughout the day. If they wish, they may bring a bottle or carton of juice or squash to have with their lunch but not throughout the day.

Drop off and pick up

Please can I remind everyone that dogs should not be brought onto the school grounds at all. We do encourage children to bike or scooter to school, however please can children dismount at the school gates.

Please do remember that the only cars that should park in the layby are parents with a 'blue badge', the school bus, and any other school transport (e.g. coach on a Wednesday) also need access to the layby to safely deliver or collect children from school. Please therefore can no other parents use the layby for parking when dropping off or collecting their children from school.

Attendance

Please continue to ensure that your child comes to school everyday that they possibly can. We are working extremely hard to enable all the children to not be disadvantaged by their lost learning due to the issues over the last 18 months and therefore they need to be here, in school, for us to be able to support them to be the best they can be .

Any holidays taken in term time, unless there are extenuating circumstances, is recorded as unauthorised absence and you could be fined. If you do take your child out of school, please be honest with us about the reason. If it is for a holiday you do need to complete a specific form and potentially speak to Mrs Humphrys.

Please can I remind everyone to inform us promptly if your child is absent from school, we do need a message via telephone or email as early as possible, by 9.30 am at the latest, however sooner is preferable. If we do not hear from you we have a duty of care to make contact to establish where your child is. We will keep ringing you until we get a reply. If we don't get a reply we could have to report your child as a missing child.

We know this is sometimes difficult but whenever possible please try and make any appointments outside of school hours, or at the beginning or end of the school day.

Being late does also have an impact on your child's learning, as this starts the minute they walk through the door and if your child is late (5 minutes after the start time) they will miss vital teacher input and new learning for that day. We also have interventions, which support gaps in your child's learning, starting as soon as they arrive, so again if they are late they are not able to access these effectively.

Attendance this week (Friday-Thursday)

Lilies - 90.23% Tulips - 88.14% Roses - 87.92% Daffodils - 84.81% Overall% - 87.78% Our attendance is down this week however, unfortunately a lot of our children have been struggling with various unpleasant illnesses. We do hope everyone who has been ill this week is better or starts to feel better soon.

Keeping children safe: Covid 19-

Please can I remind you that if your child or anyone in the family shows any of the following symptoms you should seek a PCR covid test ASAP

A new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell.

Please then follow the guidance in relation to isolating given by Track and Trace. Do inform school if your child tests positive or if they are advised to isolate.
