School Dinners and Packed Lunches

We would like to request that parents choose lunches with their children ahead of the school day (including highlighting if they are a packed lunch) to not only support the children in their choices, but to speed up the registration process so learning can begin quicker each morning.

Breaktime snacks

A polite reminder that children in school are able to bring a snack into school. This snack needs to be **cheese or fruit only**.

Homework

All children in classes 2,3,4 will have homework set on their Google Classroom. Each child should now have all their passwords on their reading records for them to access the Google Classroom, TT Rockstars/Numbots and Ed Shed (Classes 3 and 4).

Each week, the homework will go live on the Google Classrooms by 4pm on Fridays. All children have been sent an invite to their new Google Classroom which will require them to accept the invite to see updates.

Please can you also ensure your child brings their reading record into school each day. We will remind them to bring these home. We have also relaunched the 'Fab 50' with the children - a personal reading challenging which the children LOVE! For reads to be counted, their reading records need to be in school each day - staff will not count these on Friday mornings ahead of assembly but will ensure this is completed earlier in the week.

Reading Books

For our children who are accessing phonics, they will be bringing home this week a RWI (Read, Write Inc) black and white reading book. This book is the focus book for practicing reading skills which will be matched to your child's correct phonetic level.

For children accessing Miss Rand's phonics group, they will continue to bring home a library book only, until they have mastered all set 1 sounds.

All parents of children in Reception and Year 1 will be invited to a future phonics meeting with Mrs Reynolds. The date for this will be shared once finalised.

Children who no longer access phonics will bring home a book banded book (if continuing on the reading scheme) or a free reader book once they have achieved this level. If you have any questions about this, please speak with your class teacher.

PF kits

Please can we request that PE kits (including trainers) are sent into school on Mondays and taken home on Fridays. Although we try to keep PE to our set days, sometimes there are unplanned alterations to the timetable where the children will have PE in a different session.

For children with pierced ears, please can children be taught how to independently remove these for PE or how to cover these with micropore tape or plasters.

First Aid - Red Bands

Red bands are used by staff to highlight when your child had bumped their head in school and received medical attention from one of our designated first aiders. It is important that you are made aware as the monitoring period following any head injury should be for 48 hours. In this period, if your child displays signs of drowsiness, persistent headaches or sickness (to name a few symptoms), please seek further medical assistance. On the red band, you will have the date and time of the incident recorded. A member of your child's staff team will also verbally pass over the incident to you
