





At our school, the safety of pupils and staff is our top priority. Lock-down drills known as invacuation, as well as fire drills, are practiced so everyone knows exactly what to do if there is a situation where we need to stay safely inside the building, such as an intruder, a grounds issue or similar.

These procedures help staff and children respond quickly and calmly, keeping everyone as safe as possible. Practicing regularly ensures that in an actual emergency, everyone is prepared and confident in what to do and we will be practising these in the coming weeks.
