



Dear Parents and Guardians,

We are excited to share some important updates regarding our approach to attendance at Kellington Primary School. Our commitment to providing the best support for your children and families has led us to collaborate with an organisation known as Inclusive Attendance. Together, we aim to empower children to attend school regularly and overcome any potential barriers they may face in their educational journey.

Our new approach is rooted in an inclusive attendance model designed to ensure that everyone - our staff, families, and children - fully understands their individual roles and collective responsibilities in supporting school attendance, active engagement in learning, and addressing potential barriers.

Effective communication with all our families is central to our values at Kellington Primary School. In light of this, we will transition from reporting attendance in percentage form to a focus on the number of days missed. This shift will simplify the process, enhance communication, and help all children and families have a clear understanding of the impact of missed school days on education. We will be sending information to all families about the attendance of their children each half term.

Our renewed focus on this inclusive attendance approach will ultimately help us create a culture where everyone at Kellington Primary School shares the collective responsibility for school attendance.
