Our New Attendance Raffle!

In today's assembly, we explained to the children that there would be an opportunity to receive a £20 voucher to spend on something they would like.

How this will work is from Monday 21st November, each day that your child arrives on time, their name will be entered into a raffle. On the last day of term, 5 lucky winners will be announced. This means that their name could be added up to 20 times, giving them 20 opportunities to win.

If your child happens to be unwell and needs to be absent from school, we ask that you contact the school office on the first day of sickness by 8.55am to inform us of the reasons why. If your child happens to still be unwell throughout the week, please contact the school office to keep them up to date. If we haven't heard from you, someone from the school office will contact you to see how your child is doing.

Things like sickness and diarrhoea would require a 48 hour absence from school, from the last bout and would not require you to contact on the second day.

Over the last few weeks, it has become apparent that some of the children have been using inappropriate language in school and on the playground. We don't condone the use of swearing and foul language to be used and in the event of a member of staff being made aware or hearing a child swear will result in children being moved down the zone board. Please can we ask that you take some time to speak at home regarding the use of swearing.

Anti Bullying Week

As a whole school, we started our Anti-Bullying Week discussing the difference between a friend and a peer, exploring how we might be different around these types of people. The children all agreed that a friend is someone you trust and want to spend more time with and a peer is someone you spend time with at school and in class but at the same time is kind. We then went on to discuss the difference between being unkind and being bullied. This was a great opportunity for any misconceptions to be looked at. The children can now say that bullying happens intentionally and on multiple occasions.

The theme for this year's Anti-Bullying Week is 'Reach Out'. All the children listened to a story and explored the message behind it and how it is important for children to speak to someone if they feel that they might be being bullied. Everyone could identify someone that they could speak to if they felt unhappy.

We have also discussed what bullying is:

'the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online'.

In classes, the children all completed a piece of writing, highlighting how to reach out if they see bullying or a part of bullying. Daffodils and Roses were given the opportunity to watch the official Anti-Bullying week video and alongside this they have both created a 'Reach Out Recipe' explaining how to reach out.
