What do local governors do?

School Governors are responsible for strategic leadership and accountability within schools. In practice this means that governing bodies are responsible for such things as setting a range

of school policies and ensuring they are adhered to; setting and monitoring the school budget; monitoring the progress that the school is making and setting targets for school improvement. Governors are not involved in the operational running of the school. The daily management of the school is the responsibility of the Headteacher.

Homework

For homework for the rest of this half term, we would like to focus heavily on reading. Research proves that success in reading is paramount to success at school. We have purchased new reading records for children to take home and would like to ask for your support, by encouraging your child to read regularly at home.
