School Governors are responsible for strategic leadership and accountability within schools. In practice this means that governing bodies are responsible for such things as setting a range of school policies and ensuring they are adhered to; setting and monitoring the school budget; monitoring the progress that the school is making and setting targets for school improvement. Governors are not involved in the operational running of the school. The daily management of the school is the responsibility of the Headteacher.

Reading

Fab 50!

We will be promoting reading at home through the Fab 50! Each time your child reads at home, please sign their reading record book (one signature per day). Please also number each read, perhaps by putting a number at the side of the signature. We will be tracking their home reads in school, and when they get to 50, they can choose a book from a selection, to keep for themselves. Unless, the children are free readers (KS2), the book must be the reading book which has been sent home, for the children to practise their reading skills.

We also continue to encourage reading for pleasure at home, which could be reading a bedtime story or having a story read to them, or enjoying the pictures in books and retelling
